Collisions with other Cyclist's, Members of the Public and Animals Head injury, General injury to body	A – F	3	3	9	Staff to be vigilant in making sure that the public go the correct way around the trails & Tarmac Track. The trails are all way marked, signed or painted to state the direction/route that cyclists must follow, the ability/experience needed to undertake them as well as "No Entry" signs. A dedicated fast lane on the tar mac track for fast cyclists to 'ONLY' use (road bikes). If public or cyclist are seen going around the wrong way on the tarmac track, in the fast lane, on the MTB trails, staff will inform them to abide by direction of the route and park rules. Signage to advise the public to continuously wear their helmets while cycling in the park. Staff to advise public to wear helmets if seen without one. Signage to inform public to dismount bikes while traveling through the play park to avoid collisions. Emergency contact number located around the park and on the back of trail maps. First Aider on site to deal with first aid emergencies.

Low Risk - risk can be acceptable.

Medium Risk – acceptable with adequate control measures in place.

High Risk – action must be prioritised and timetabled to reduce risk to an acceptable level.
